Donald Trump is the 45th President of the United States. Trump has campaigned in several elections, beginning in 2000. Far from a career politician, Trump made a name for himself in business — in particular, real estate — and entertainment ventures, most notably as co-producer and original host of *The Apprentice*, which aired on NBC from 2003 to 2015. As president, Trump has pursued many controversial policies, from his harsh stance on undocumented immigrants to banning transgender troops from the military to his withdrawal of the United States from the Paris climate accord in favor of boosting fossil fuel production.
